GENERAL RULES

1. Open to 3rd grade and under.
2. Each exhibitor shall specify the number of entries they plan to exhibit. Division and class numbers do not need to be specified at the time of entry. Exhibitors are permitted one entry per class.
3. Additional entries may be made the day of the show by exhibitors who are pre-registered in Farm Crops.
4. Each entry tag must show variety name. If no variety is listed, the entry will not be placed.
5. Champion and Reserve Champion will be named in each division.
6. Exhibitors will not receive premiums but will be recognized with a ribbon for participation.

FIELD CORN - DIVISION 1

1. Ears of corn must be in natural conditions at both ends and have no more than 1% of kernels missing. Do not cut off or remove tips of ears.
2. The name of the variety or hybrid must be shown on the entry tag.
3. The judges will evaluate entries in Classes on maturity and quality (i.e. insects or disease damage).
4. Entries should be from the previous year's crop and should not have been previously shown at fair.

CLASS

1. Single Ear, any variety or hybrid
2. Longest Ear Field Corn
3. Ten Ears, yellow corn, any variety or hybrid.
4. Shortest Ear, any variety or hybrid.
5. Deformed Ear, any variety or hybrid.

SMALL GRAINS FULL GALLON SAMPLES DIVISION 2

1. One full quart of product is required for each entry.
2. Entries previously shown at the Fair will be disqualified
3. The variety name is required on all entry tags.
4. Entries will be weighed and undergo visual judging.

SHEAF GRAINS - DIVISION 3

1. Entries must be shown in sheaves, two inches in diameter at the center band.
2. Judges will penalize over and undersized sheaves.
3. Heads must be left in natural condition.
4. Variety name must be specified on each entry tag.
5. Exhibits previously shown at the Fair will be disqualified.

FORAGES, GRASSES, AND LEGUMES SHEAVES - DIVISION 4

1. All entries in this division will be judged from the standpoint of the usefulness as hay.
2. Entries are to be shown in sheaves, three inches in diameter at the center band.
3. Variety name must be specified on each entry tag.
4. All sheaves must be dried. The exhibit is to be dry hay quality for the show.

HAY SLICES - DIVISION 5

1. Crops in this division will be displayed as space is available.
2. Variety name must be specified on each entry tag.
3. Hay slices should not exceed 24 inches by 4 inches. The slice should be taken from a bale of hay. If the bales are larger than 24 inches by 24 inches, a slice cut from a larger bale is permitted. Care should be taken to try to maintain the actual quality and condition of the stored forage. The hay sample must be wrapped tightly in clear plastic. You can shrink wrap, garbage bags, clear plastic food wrap or other suitable material. A hole will be made in the wrap for judges access to the sample.
